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God has blessed us with wonderful full-time missionaries and many volunteers who share in the work in Alaska. Please pray for Rev. 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**KAKN**- Operating 24/7, KAKN radio broadcasts the message of hope, the good news of Jesus Christ, into remote villages of Alaska where there is no pastor or regular church services. Rev. Bob Lee serves as our station manager. In addition, KAKN serves through the Emergency Alert system, broadcasts the government fishing regulations, public service announcements and broadcasts the local basketball games. Alaska Project Manager Rod Scheel has gained permission from the FCC and has begun working to expand the coverage of KAKN through additional translators accessing the internet.



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**The Net** – God brings the world to Naknek each summer as thousands of people come for the commercial salmon fishing. This growing ministry started 5 years ago as a coffee shop/internet cafe, where fishermen and cannery workers can come for a cup of coffee, connect with home via the internet and most importantly be engaged in conversation about the Gospel of Jesus.

### Village Vacation Bible School

Last summer our VBS team of four young adults shared the Gospel message in 7 remote villages of Bristol Bay as well as in Naknek and South Naknek. This is our fourth year of this ministry and in some cases, this is the only exposure to the Gospel that the children of these villages have all year. Our financial needs for this ministry include a stipend for four team members, air transportation to Naknek, AK, expenses for flying to the villages and food for the team with a total cost of about \$2,500 per team member

## FLAPS

How do you do ministry in a state like Alaska that has very few roads? Dog sleds or four wheelers can't make it across the open waters of the Bering Sea during the winter months.

The Wright brothers had no idea of how their invention of the airplane could benefit the kingdom of God. Did you know that Alaska has the highest number of pilots per capita of any U.S. state?

Our Alaskan missionaries are very dependent on our FLAPS airplanes. Here is just a glimpse of how these planes are used:

- Sunday Services in the outlying villages
- Weekly services and Bible studies in South Naknek
- Flights out to our radio translators for repair and upkeep
- Bringing youth into Naknek for retreats
- Getting our VBS team out to the villages during the summer
- Transporting area youth to Summer Bible camp
- Transporting ministry cargo
- Helping with medical needs and other emergencies



The Free Lutheran Association of Pilot Supporters, Inc. is a non-profit corporation dedicated to reaching lost souls for the Lord Jesus Christ using airplanes as tools for ministry. FLAPS operates four small aircraft. Our Minneapolis based Cessna 182 is used by AFLC staff and ministry personnel in the "Lower 48". Our Alaska fleet consists of a Cessna 175, a Piper Cherokee Six, and our newest plane gifted to us, a Piper Cherokee 140. God has blessed us with an AFLC pastor/pilot, Jeremy Crowell, who flies and maintains these planes in often difficult weather conditions.

Pray for God's protection for these flights and the finances for the fuel and maintenance of our planes which allows us to share the Gospel in Alaska.

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
